

# Vettes on the River Parking

## Before you Arrive

Please bring your parking placard (dash voucher, printed) or event registration receipt and any confirmation mails related to apparel or purchases (on phone is fine).

Your registration receipt (or parking placard) serves as your entry ticket to the event, but is different from your parking placard which should be displayed clearly on your dashboard after parking.

If you did not receive your placard in advance, blank placards will be available at the registration tent upon arrival.

## Arrival & Check In

Do **NOT** line up before 7:30 AM.

Upon entering LeClaire, follow all posted signs and directions from event volunteers and law enforcement. If traffic becomes heavy, local law enforcement may direct vehicles to temporary staging areas until parking is available.

*If you are arriving with a Corvette club or group*, you must stay together in a single line to be parked together. Have your lead driver inform volunteers how many vehicles are in your group.

## Parking Instructions

Upon arrival, follow all posted signage, listen carefully to event volunteers and law enforcement, and proceed directly to your assigned parking location.

For everyone's safety, remain in your vehicle until you have been fully parked. Please be patient, our volunteers work hard to park everyone quickly, safely, and efficiently.

Once parked, display your parking placard/voucher clearly on your dashboard, secure your vehicle, and head to the registration tent.

## Registration Tent

After parking, all participants should visit the registration tent to check in, pick up goody bag, collect pre-ordered apparel or merchandise, and receive any event updates or important information.

Be sure to verify any apparel orders before leaving the tent. If you need a replacement placard/voucher, our team will be happy to assist you there.

## Departure

At the conclusion of the event, local law enforcement will assist with traffic flow to help participants exit safely and efficiently. Please follow their directions and use patience as traffic clears.
